



## OBITUARY

John Bass was born on January 31, 1895 in Calhoun Falls, South Carolina. He expired on Tuesday, January 1, 1985 at 7:15 p.m. in Veteran's Administration Medical Center. He served his country in the armed forces in World War I.

He came to Buffalo, New York as a young man, with his wife, the late Ellen Gary Bass and son, General. Shortly after arriving in Buffalo, he joined Bethel A.M.E. Church, then located on Vine Street. He was a devoted member of Bethel for over sixty years. He served on the Usher Board, having the position of Treasurer of the Usher Board and he was Treasurer of the Men's Club. He was a loyal, dedicated and sincere member who had great influence not only with his family, but also with those whose lives he reached out and touched in his own quiet manner.

He became employed at the Pullman Company and Plastergon Wallboard Co., soon after his arrival in Buffalo. Later he established his own business, John Bass & Son Interior Decorator, which he operated successfully for many years throughout Erie and Niagara Counties, until his retirement in 1974.
